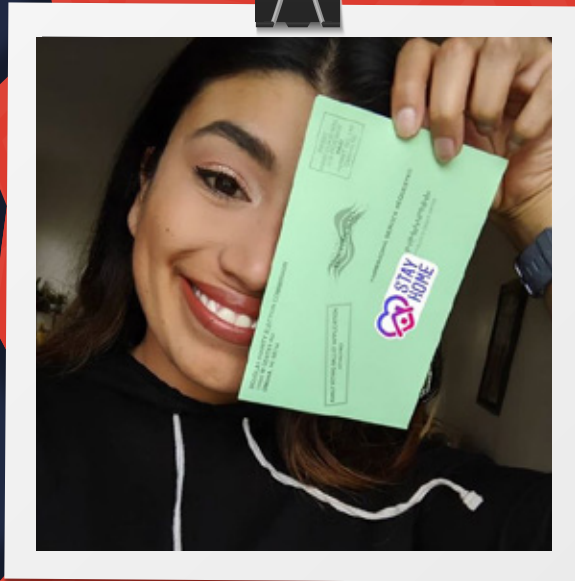
Our Mission

Our Vision

We will build a more just, inclusive, and engaged Nebraska by increasing the year-round civic participation of our nonprofit members' supporters and underrepresented communities, including: African-Americans, Latinos, Native Americans, Asian American and Pacific Islanders (AAPI), new citizens, low-income families, women, LGBT Nebraskans, and young voters.

Impact Highlights

In 2019, the Nebraska Table and its members embarked on a 5-year strategic planning process. Together they identified three strategic directions: Building Equitable Institutions, Cultivating People Power, and Seizing “Of the Moment” Opportunities. 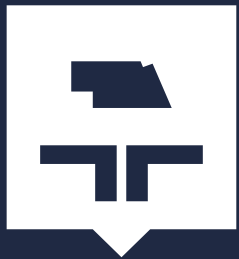

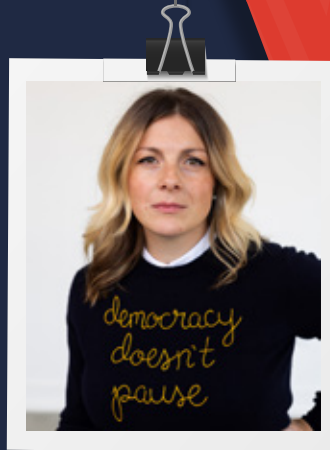
